

- NSW recorded 1,405 locally acquired cases of COVID-19 in the 24 hours to 8pm last night. Tragically 6 people have died.
- Yesterday over 107,000 people got vaccinated, which is a great outcome. More than 42.5% are fully vaccinated, but we must keep going. Please come forward for your first and second vaccinations as soon as possible. Book today at nsw.gov.au
- Stay-at-home orders for adults who have received both doses of the COVID-19 vaccine will be lifted from the Monday after NSW passes the 70 per cent double vaccination target. Schools will still reopen on 25 October.
- From Saturday 11 September, lockdown will be lifted in some low-risk regional areas which have had no COVID cases for at least 14 days. Please make sure you know the restrictions in your area <https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/rules>
- We remain concerned about previously mentioned suburbs in West and Southwest Sydney, particularly Cumberland, Canterbury Bankstown and Liverpool LGAs. Thank you to everyone in the areas of concern.
- We are also seeing an increase in cases in the Inner West, including Glebe, Waterloo, and Marrickville. Please come forward for vaccination and look out for symptoms.
- A call out to everyone in regional NSW to remain vigilant and get vaccinated, especially in the Central Coast and Wollongong, where there has been an increase in cases.
- At any stage, if there is a spike in cases, we may have to bring back restrictions to keep the community safe.
- There is a light at the end of the tunnel and we have a lot to look forward to. Together we can achieve a level of freedom. Getting vaccinated is the key to our long-term success.
