

- Across NSW, more than 11.8 million vaccines have now been administered! 92.5% of people over 16 have received a first dose, and 82.3% have received both doses.
- 76.1% of 12-15 year olds have received one dose and 40.9% are now fully vaccinated. This is a great achievement.
- There were 372 locally acquired cases of COVID-19 reported in NSW in the 24 hours to 8pm last night. Sadly, one person has died.
- Thank you to everyone who has come forward for vaccination and to all the GPs, pharmacists and other healthcare workers who have been administering vaccines across our state.
- If you have any symptoms, no matter how mild, or are a close or casual contact of a person with COVID-19, you must isolate and get tested immediately, even if you are fully vaccinated.
- We are concerned about sewage detection in areas with no known cases, including Lightning Ridge, Armidale, Uralla, Inverell and Nyngan. Residents in these areas are urged to monitor for the onset of symptoms and get tested.
- We look forward to welcoming even more students back into the classroom next week. We particularly urge young people in Southwest Sydney and the Hunter region to come and get vaccinated.
